

Special Projects - BCS Wales Hub

FY 2023-24

- Engaged with employers, educators and branch network to build a joined up vision of how we can work together in Wales
- Hosted a round table dinner to develop strategic focus
- Launched BCS Wales Hub at Cardiff University event
- Developed a new student chapter at Wrexham University to help widen BCS engagement into North Wales
- Focussed resource on increasing BCS employer organisations in Wales and enablement to support funding of the BCS Wales Hub
- Initiated Community Leader recruitment*

*The role is now being reviewed to make it more manageable, with the intention of splitting the role into a Chair of the Hub Leadership group and multiple ambassador roles to help with advocacy and enablement.

Special Projects

Special Projects - BCS Wales Hub

- Development of the Hub's first digital skills gap initiative Return, Restart or Pivot into Tech scheduled for February 2025
- The event is a pilot to be hosted in Cardiff aimed primarily at supporting Women into careers in technology, although open to anyone looking to career change into tech – this event will feature talks on entering the profession, guidance on funding available, how to support career transitioners and also include a careers fair with recruiters and trainers.
- Reconvene the Hub Leadership Group to meet quarterly, along with appointment of a Chair person.
- BCS Wales Hub Digital Skills Report
- All Wales Webinar Programme Events
- Continue to broaden BCS influence in Wales, with an increased focus on policy makers and continued employer engagement.

Vice Chair's Report: STEM in Wales

- Aim of the Branch is to promote STEM subjects across Wales
- A group of volunteers working with the BCS and See Science (The STEM body for Wales) to promote the STEM subjects to help create a future workforce with the skills the skills required to meet future UK needs
- This group mainly focuses on robotics and used robots build using Lego to illustrate what robotics is all about

Vice Chair's Report: STEM in Wales

The group has:

- Produced a lesson plan to help teach robotics available as a resource for teachers
- Delivers presentations to schools linked to their curriculum
- Works with companies involved with robotics
- Puts on exhibitions at science fairs and other events
- Supported large STEM events including Teen Tech, DVLA Code challenge ...
- The group would be interested in recruiting new members
 - knowledge of robotics would be an advantage but not essential.

Computer Heritage Coordinator's Report: **Branch Special Projects**



South Wales BCS Branch has supported historical work locally since 2007, through its support of:

- Swansea University's History of Computing Collection which is a substantial museum and archive
- The BCS Annual History Lecture held in April with international speakers
- BCS Project with Swansea University to discover What did south Wales ever do for computing?
- The recently founded Cardiff History of Computing Committee (CHoCC) is based on a collection of equipment from the 1960s at the University
 - CHoCC organsies pop-up exhibitions to engage with the public with retro computing

Branch Engagement

Higher Education's engagement with the Branch has been less frequent over the past 3 years down to additional pressure on staff due to the pandemic, and in some cases, staff retirement

New links have been formed more recently with a number of Higher Ed institutions across the region and the committee now has representatives from Cardiff University, Swansea University and University of South Wales. The Branch plans to host an event bringing members from all 3 HE institutions together at least once this coming academic year.

Student Chapters

Student signup again this year, with heavier promotion of BCS SIG activities and increased engagement with SW Branch. Networks include Cyber Societies, and three new student focused / led Cyber clusters Student Chapter discussions are ongoing.



Geneve Purayil and Lakshmi Sikha were chosen as finalists in their selective year groups for the BCS Lovelace Colloquium, which took place at the University of Liverpool on 4 April, an entry level conference event for young women.

Geneve Purayil won first prize in the Second Year category for her poster, titled 'Al-Illuminating Drug Discovery: Shedding Light on Al's Impact in Pharma.



Geneve said: "Winning gave me a stronger sense of confidence in my own abilities to research and explain complex computing topics in a creative manner....

"However, what really impacted me the most was talking with other contestants about their work, especially third year students and masters students, and seeing what they could achieve in their dissertations made me excited to start my own next year."


