

Chair's Report: Special Projects

BCS in Wales – Regional Hubs

Regional hubs join the dots between BCS stakeholders in a region to create an **ethical and competent profession** working towards advancing **a society that is resilient and thriving in a digital world.**

Practically, hubs provide BCS as a community of employers, educators and members with an opportunity to learn about stakeholder needs, helping them to solve challenges and curate activity through building local partnerships which help to address:

- Development of early career professionals
- · Supporting graduates into careers
- Facilitating exchange of knowledge between educational providers and employers

The Computer Revolution and Us: Pioneering People and Places
having the aim:

To explore the history of computing and its impact in south Wales based on the memories and experiences of the members of the BCS, present and past.

So far, a small number of members have volunteered and we have made progress in looking at the early development of computing in the schools of south Wales. There is so much more to uncover and preserve!

Member Engagement: To foster a sense of community and encourage active participation among BCS members.


Knowledge Sharing: To provide a platform for sharing industry insights, best practices, and the latest trends in technology.












We sent out a survey to understand the specific challenges, aspirations, and expectations of the early careers community. Responses were low but here are key findings from the survey.









Summary Points

- •The majority of respondents are postgraduate students, recently graduated, or undergraduate students.
- Professional development is the primary reason for joining the branch.
- •The most popular areas of interest are software development, AI, and machine learning and cybersecurity.
- Most respondents are not aware of the specialist groups in BCS.
- Lack of work experience is a top challenge faced by respondents.
- •Other significant challenges include Limited access to industry networks, Lack of professional development opportunities, and difficulty finding employment.
- •Some respondents felt the survey was not relevant to them, suggesting possible issues in survey distribution

Education Liaison: Branch Engagement with HE and Student Chapters

Branch Engagement

Higher Educations engagement with the Branch has been less frequent over the past 3 years down to additional pressure on staff due to the pandemic, and in some cases, staff retirement

New links have been formed more recently with a number of HE institutions across the region and the committee now has representatives from Cardiff Met, Cardiff University, Swansea University and University of South Wales. The Branch plans to host an event at a HE institution at least once this academic year.

Student Chapters

Student signup again this year, with heavier promotion of BCS SIG activities and increased engagement with SW Branch. Networks include Cyber Societies and three new student focused / led Cyber clusters Student Chapter discussions are ongoing.




Other activities

2022/23 Budget
