5. Treasurer's Report: The Chairman reported on the budget:

Budget 2022-23 Requested £4,640, Allocated £1,355, Spent £1,442.03 Budget 2023-24 Requested £2,043, Allocated £1,343

The applied funds and actual fund spent did not match and had to be reallocated/categorised. Majority of funds was spent on event refreshments. Books balanced at the financial year end. 3CT sponsored event with £200 contribution.

Fund allocations of  $\pounds$ 1,343 for the current financial year will need to be reallocated/categorised again to match actual spent.
